


We're looking for volunteers to support bereaved children and young people- Can you help?

Cruse Bereavement Support volunteers provide support to children and young people affected by the death of someone close to them. We provide 1-1 and sometimes group support to children aged 7-18. For children younger than 7 we provide advice and support to parents/guardians as children of this age are usually too young to effectively engage in bereavement support with a volunteer. If you have the skills listed below, want to make a difference to bereaved children and young people and meet new people we want to hear from you.

What happens next?

- 1. You need to attend one of our information sessions to find out more about what volunteering is like at Cruse.
- 2. If you then decide to apply, and your application is successful, you will be invited to a pre-course interview



- 3. You will then be invited to attend our **Children and Young People Bereavement Foundation** course as well as mandatory training for **Safeguarding**. Attendance on the course is a total of 32 hours over 6 days.
- 4. If you successfully pass the course, you will receive a local induction in your region to learn more about the client support in your area.
